

## INSIDE THE CHURCH

- Mote: Memorials lettered A M are on walls. Brief notes of the brasses have been included here, but for more detail see "Guide to St.Mary's Church Ewelme" which is referred to in this text as the "booklet."
- A1. (Portrait in relief) Grenville HAMPDEN Esgr J.P.D.L the son of Renn D.HAMPDEN, Lord Bishop of Hereford and Mary Lovell his wife, born Sepr MDCCCXXXV, died Decr MDCCCLXXXI In memoriam
- A2. (below A1) In memory of Capt Geoffrey HAMPDEN R.N died 30 May 1951. His wife Cicely Mary died 3 February 1962 and their son Grenville Sub Lieut Fleet Air Arm missing in Norway 13 April 1940
- B1. In memory of George EYRE solicitor died January 27th 1885 aged 81 years
- B2. This epitaph was on the tomb of Edward HALE Esq (son of Matthew HALE Knight, Lord Chief Justice of England) who died Novr 14 1682 & is buried in this churchyard

My soul the drop of life's returning home As tydes ebb to the ocean whence they come Till by the great command she does returne To reespouse (in spite of Death) her bride Which cant divorse tho it a while divide Nor for a twinkling of an eye Though I should a thousand ages lye

  This monument in memory of Edward BURTON D.D Canon of Christchurch and Rector of Ewelme is erected by his widow not to record the virtues of the dead but to exhort the living to follow the example of their faithful and affectionate minister, the object of whose life was to inculcate from Christian motives practical holiness. Distinguished and admired as he was with reason in the University as a learned perspicuous and most assiduous professor of divinity, his chief delight was in this parish to win souls to Christ and to imitate his Lord and Saviour by preaching the gospel to the poor.
