

## Thatchings

This was one of the oldest private homes in Ewelme dating from the 16<sup>th</sup> Century. In 2022 it was tragically burned down. Most of it was destroyed except for the brick inglenook fireplace and chimney stack. It has now been rebuilt with an almost identical exterior.

In 1881 landlord Edward Poore rented the cottage, then divided into three dwellings, one up one down, with back-to-back inglenook fireplaces, and incorporating William Delafield's working smithy at the stream end.
